

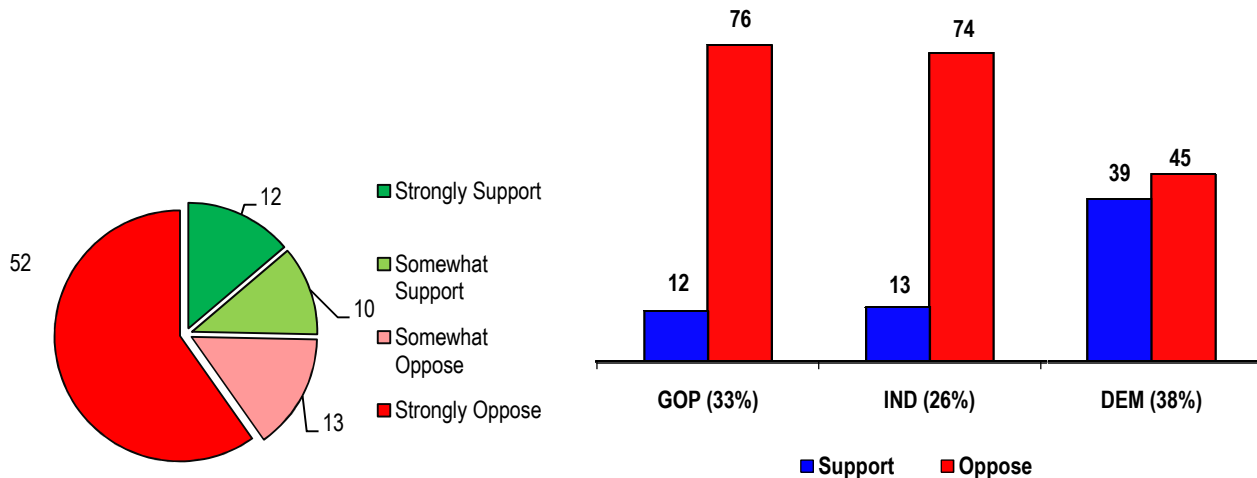

Please find key findings of a telephone survey of 400 likely voters. This survey was conducted April 29-30 and May 3; it has a margin of error of plus or minus 4.99 percentage points (+/- 4.99%) in 95 out of 100 cases.

Voters in Arkansas oppose “card check” legislation currently being considered in Congress. When asked the question, “Do you support legislation being considered by Congress that would make it easier for labor unions to organize by eliminating the vote by secret ballot?”, voters are overwhelmingly opposed by a margin of 65% to 22%. There is also opposition across party lines (see below).



In addition, of those surveyed who support the measure (22%), 56% are less likely to support this proposed legislation when asked, “If you knew that this legislation would eliminate a workers right to a secret vote in labor elections and allow government bureaucrats to set worker wages and benefits would this make you more likely or less likely to support?”

The demographic breakdown of the survey is as follows:

- + 33% Republican; 26% Independent; 38% Democrat
- + 81% White; 15% African American
- + 52% Female
- + 24% Congressional District 1; 26% Congressional District 2; 26% Congressional District 3; 24% Congressional District 4
